4th Grade

Language Arts: TUTORING on Monday for 4th grade

- Last week the students finished up the preposition unit.
- This week the students will review and be assessed on prepositions; we will also begin a mini unit (a "munit"!) on persuasive writing.

Reading:

- Last week worked on our mythology unit with vocabulary & literary elements.
- This week we will wrap up mythology and then on to our last whole class read, James and the Giant Peach. We are trying for an AR quiz on this book by June 2.

Math: No math tutoring this week.

- Last week the students learned how to add/subtract angles.
- This week the students will learn how to classify shapes/symmetry.
- Assessment on Thursday, 5/25/17: classifying shapes and symmetry

Social Studies:
