Dear Saint Ambrose Families,

We are excited to announce this summer that we will be partnering with Medina County District Library to have all our incoming Kindergarten through fifth grade students participate in the 2019 Summer Reading Game. With this partnership, we want to support your child's growth in reading and help foster a love for reading. The 2019 Summer Reading Game will be in place of our traditional reading projects that were assigned each summer by their teacher. The 2019 Summer Reading Game will run from **May 31, 2019 - August 10, 2019**. The students will need to register through one of the Medina County Libraries and pick up a game board. We do not have the game board at St. Ambrose.

As part of the summer reading program, your child will need to read 20 minutes (audiobooks do count). For each 20 minutes, your child will need to color in one day on the game board and log on the back side of their game or on the back of this letter the books they have read while playing the game this summer. The students will need to bring the game board into any Medina County Library to have a librarian sign the game board and pick up their prizes after your child has read for 10, 20 and 30 days. If your child reads for 30 days and completes the game board they will receive a brand new book from the library and a chance to win the grand prize: a party with the BookMobile. This year the library will also be offering two backpacks filled with STEAM supplies. Right up St. Ambrose School's alley!

To get credit/grade for completing the game board for the entire 30 days your child needs to bring the game board and log to their teacher by Friday, August 16, 2019. They will be able to take AR quizzes on the books they have read over the summer if your child chooses to. If your family does not live in Medina County they can also complete the game from the public library in your county.

We hope everyone has a wonderful summer reading and we cannot wait to hear about all the adventures your children will have over the summer!
